# WIDOWS: RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CHURCH, FAMILY, AND WIDOWS THEMSELVES (1 TIMOTHY 5:3–16)

#### Introduction

- 1. The Church's Responsibility: The church must financially support certain kinds of widows.
  - 1.1. She does not have other family to help her but is "left all alone" (vv. 5, 16).
  - 1.2. She is "not less than sixty years of age" (v. 9).
  - 1.3. She is godly (vv. 5, 9–10).
    - 1.3.1. She "has set her hope on God" (v. 5).
    - 1.3.2. She "continues in supplications and prayers night and day" (v. 5).
    - 1.3.3. She had "been the wife of one husband" (v. 9).
    - 1.3.4. She has "a reputation for good works" (v. 9).
    - 1.3.5. She "has brought up children" (v. 10).
    - 1.3.6. She "has shown hospitality" (v. 10).
    - 1.3.7. She "has washed the feet of the saints" (v. 10).
    - 1.3.8. She "has cared for the afflicted" (v. 10).
    - 1.3.9. She "has devoted herself to every good work" (v. 10).

# 2. The Familiy's Responsibility: Children and grandchildren must financially support their widowed parents and grandparents.

- 2.1. This shows "godliness to their own household" (v. 4).
- 2.2. "This is pleasing in the sight of God" (v. 4).
- 2.3. This is above reproach; not doing this brings reproach (v. 7).
- 2.4. This is essential for keeping the Christian faith; not doing this amounts to denying the faith and being "worse than an unbeliever" (v. 8).
- 2.5. This frees the church of an extra burden "so that it may care for those who are truly widows" (v. 16).

## 3. The Widow's Responsibility: Widows must live for God.

- 3.1. Widows should live like *real* widows (see §1 above).
- 3.2. Widows should not be self-indulgent (v. 6).
- 3.3. Widows should not share the negative traits of some younger widows (vv. 11–15)
  - 3.3.1. "Their passions draw them away from Christ" (v. 11).
  - 3.3.2. They "incur condemnation for having abandoned their former faith" (v. 12).
  - 3.3.3. "They learn to be idlers, going about from house to house" (v. 13).
  - 3.3.4. They learn to be "gossips and busybodies, saying what they should not" (v. 13).
- 3.4. Younger widows should "marry, bear children, manage their households, and give the adversary no occasion for slander" (vv. 14–15).
